

RESOLUTION NO. 3385

A RESOLUTION of the Port Commission of the Port of Seattle Declaring Certain Personal Property Surplus (Bromma Spreader Beams and Washington Cranes) for Port District Purposes and further declaring that said property should be Sold or disposed of as provided by statute.

WHEREAS, the Port of Seattle has owned the personal property described as Bromma Beam Serial No. 2321, Port of Seattle No. 146 estimated value at \$30,000; and Bromma Beam Serial No. 2319, Port of Seattle No. 147, estimated value at \$35,000; and Washington Cranes Serial No. 5294, Port of Seattle No. 19, estimated value at \$75,000; and Serial No. 5367, Port of Seattle No. 23, estimated value at \$20,000; and

WHEREAS, said property is no longer needed for its intended purpose, or other purposes of the Port; and


WHEREAS, such property is not part of any comprehensive plan of improvement or modification thereof adopted by a vote of the people of said district; and


WHEREAS, Chapter 39.33 of the Revised Code of Washington provides that the Port may “sell, transfer, exchange, lease or otherwise dispose of any property...the state or any municipality or any political subdivision thereof...on such terms and conditions as may be mutually agreed upon...”;


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Port Commission of the Port of Seattle

that the Bromma Beam Serial No's. 2321 and 2329, Port of Seattle No. 146 and 147; and Washington Cranes Serial No. 5294 and 5367, Port of Seattle No's. 19 and 23 are no longer needed for district purposes and that it is in the best interest of said district that said property be sold for estimated value or best offer, which may include scrap value if no buyer is found within 12 months.

ADOPTED by the Port Commission of the Port of Seattle this 27th day of March, 2001, and duly authenticated in open session by the signatures of the Commissioners voting in favor thereof and the seal of the Commission.
