

## RESOLUTION NO. 3651

**A RESOLUTION** of the Port Commission of the Port of Seattle  
renaming Elliott Bay Park as Centennial Park

**WHEREAS**, the Port of Seattle (the "Port"), a municipal corporation of the State of Washington established in 1911, owns and operates a system of marine terminals and properties and Seattle-Tacoma International Airport; and

**WHEREAS**, Elliott Bay Park, located adjacent to Terminal 86 on Seattle's waterfront, is a Port-owned property consisting of eleven acres of landscaped areas with interpretive information, pedestrian and bicycle pathways and shoreline access; and

**WHEREAS**, in 2011, the Port of Seattle is commemorating the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of its founding on September 5, 1911; and

**WHEREAS**, renaming a popular and visible park in honor of the Port's Centennial will serve to further inform the King County citizens of the Port's longevity and economic contributions this region; and


**WHEREAS**, a public park is a tangible symbol of the sustainable future for the Port's next 100 years; and


**WHEREAS**, the Port of Seattle will affix signs at the park's three main entry points to designate the renaming;


**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Port Commission of the Port of Seattle that:


Section 1: Elliott Bay Park is hereby renamed Centennial Park.


**ADOPTED** by the Port Commission of the Port of Seattle at a regular meeting held this 12th day of April, 2011, and duly authenticated in open session by the signatures of the Commissioners voting in favor thereof and the seal of the Commission.
