

RESOLUTION NO 3154

A RESOLUTION of the Port Commission of the Port of Seattle endorsing Port of Seattle participation in the American Cancer Society's 17th Annual "Great American Smoke-Out" November 18, 1993

WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society's "Great American Smoke-Out" is a light-hearted effort to encourage smokers and smokeless tobacco users to give up their habit for 24-hours on Thursday, November 18, 1993, and

WHEREAS the Port of Seattle participated in the American Cancer Society's "Great American Smoke-Out" for the first time in November 1992, and

WHEREAS the Port has been awarded, for its participation in 1992, the "Outstanding Project of the Year" from the American Cancer Society, Seattle Unit, and


WHEREAS, for 16 consecutive years, millions of smokers, including some at the Port of Seattle, have participated in this event and have successfully quit their use of tobacco products, and

WHEREAS, the health benefits of not using tobacco products are substantiated and well known, and

WHEREAS, there are documented additional benefits, such as a reduction of illnesses related to tobacco products,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Port of Seattle Commission urges all smokers and smokeless tobacco users at the Port of Seattle to join the American Cancer Society's 17th Annual "Great American Smoke-Out"
