- 11. "ROADWAYS" includes areas designated by the Director for use by motor vehicles.
- 12. "RULES AND REGULATIONS" shall include these rules and regulations or any directives adopted pursuant hereto, including official Airport signs or oral directives given by Port employees.
- 13. "VEHICLES FOR HIRE" shall include all vehicles used to pick up and deliver passengers and parcels at the Airport. A separate or direct charge for transportation to or from the Airport shall not be a factor in determining that a vehicle is for hire so long as the transportation is incidental to a commercial operation. As used herin, the following definitions specifically apply:
 - a. "COURTESY CAR" means vehicles used by hotels, motels, parking lots, car rental agencies and others to pick up and deliver passengers at the Airport, normally where there is no direct charge for transportation to or from the Airport: the transportation services being incidental to a commercial operations.
 - b. "LIMOUSINE" means for hire vehicles that do not have a company designation displayed on the vehicle and generally charge on the basis of time engaged rather than distance travelled.
 - c. "PARCEL CARRIERS AND DELIVERY COMPANY" mean commercial vehicles that deliver and pick up packages at the passenger terminal
 - d. "PORT-LICENSED TAXICAB" means a taxicab having executed an Airport Taxicab Operating Agreement with the Port, authorizing it to pick up or discharge customers or packages at the Airport on the Passenger Pick-Up Drive or Passenger Check-In Drive; having paid all appropriate fees and charges therefor; and displaying a current taxicab permit decal issued by the Port.

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- e. PORT LIMITED-LICENSE TAXICAB" means a taxicab having executed an Airport Special Limited Taxicab Operating Agreement with the Port authorizing it to pick up and discharge customers or packages at the Airport on the Passenger Check-In Drive only, and only when its services are specifically requested by a customer; having paid all appropriate fees and charges therefor; and displaying a current Special Limted Taxicab permit decal issued by the Port.
- f. "NON PORT LICENSED TAXICAB" means a taxicab failing to execute either an Airport Taxicab Operating Agreement or an Airport Special Limited Taxicab Operating Agreement with the Port, or failing to pay all appropriate fees and charges relating thereto, or failing to display an appropriate current taxicab permit decal issued by the Port.
- 14. "FIRE DEPARTMENT" means the Port of Seattle Fire Department unless otherwise referenced.
- 15. "UNIFORM FIRE CODE" or "UFC" means the 1976 edition of the Uniform Fire Code and as amended.
- 16. "UNIFORM BUILDING CODE" or "UBC" means the 1976 edition of the Uniform Building Code and as amended.

- a. No non Port-licensed taxicab may pick up customers or packages at the Airport but may discharge customers on the Passenger Check-In Drive only.
- b. A Port-licensed taxicab may pick up or discharge customers or packages at the Airport on the Passenger Check-In Drive or Passenger Pick-Up Drive.
- c. A Port limited-license taxicab may pick up customers or packages at the Airport, but only when responding to a specific request for its services from a prospective customer. A Port limited-license taxicab may discharge or pick up customers or packages at the Airport on the Passenger Check-In Drive only.
- d. Port-licensed taxicab permittees and Port limited-license taxicab permittees shall be permitted to conduct operations at the Airport provided there is compliance with the conditions stated in their respective Operating Agreements and any future amendments thereto.
- 4. All vehicles for hire shall comply with the following rules and regulations:
 - a. Placing, throwing, or dropping of waste, refuse, or rubbish upon any taxi/bus stand, roadway, street, or sidewalk adjacent thereto is strictly forbidden, and should this be disregarded, the violating driver of a vehicle for hire shall clean the area upon order to do so.
 - b. The owners or operators of all vehicles for hire, their employees, invitees, and those doing business with them shall conduct themselves in an orderly and proper manner at all times.
 - c. No owner or operator of a vehicle for hire or any person at any time, while on the Airport, by words, gestures, or otherwise shall solicit, persuade, or urge any person to use or hire any vehicle for hire or other means of transportation or conveyance at the Airport.
 - d. Any driver of a vehicle for hire who violates any of these rules and regulations shall be subject to immediate expulsion from the Airport and will not be allowed to reenter the Airport without the permission of the Director. Also, such driver's vehicle permit may be revoked.

AIRPORT TAXICAB PERMITS

The following applies to taxicab operations at Sea-Tac International Airport:

Fees:

Beginning March 1, 1984, fees shall be \$125.00 per taxicab per quarter.

Eligibility Requirements:

1. Applicant's currently filed flag drop, per mile, and waiting time rates do not exceed the King County median average for the current filing period by more than ten percent (10%) rounded upward to the nearest ten cent (10%) increment.

OR

Applicant's currently filed flag drop, per mile and waiting time rates are equal to or less than the King County median average for the immediate previous filing period rounded upward to the nearest ten cent $(10\cancel{\epsilon})$ increment.

AND

2. Applicant's fare to Downtown Seattle (as defined by an area bounded on the north by Denny Street, on the south by King Street, on the west by Elliott Bay and on the east by Boren Avenue) is no more than \$20, with no extra passenger charges being allowable. This flat rate will be reviewed quarterly. If the median King County per mile rate changes by 5 percent or more from the 1984 first quarter (\$1.20), a same percentage change in the \$20 fare will result, rounded to the nearest whole dollar amount. This zoned faring restriction will be superceded by any zoned faring program instituted by King County Ordinance.

Additionally, all taxicab operators will comply with all provisions of King County Ordinances relating to taxicabs.

The following applies to taxicab operations at Sea-Tac International Airport:

Fees:

\$90.00 per taxicab per quarter. Subject to review on a quarterly basis.

Eligibility Requirements:

Taxicab operators will be eliqible to obtain taxicab permits if they meet one of the following criteria and the additional criteria set forth in the Operating Agreement:

For the quarter beginning March 1, 1981 only:

1. Applicant's rates currently filed with King County do not exceed the following amounts: Flag drop - \$1.20; per mile - \$1.20; waiting time per minute - \$0.30.

or

2. Applicant's currently filed flag drop, per mile, and waiting time rates do not exceed the King County median average for the current filing period by more than ten percent (10%) rounded upward to the nearest ten cent (10%) increment.

For all subsequent quarters:

1. Applicant's currently filed flag drop, per mile, and waiting time rates are equal to or less than the King County median average for the immediately previous filing period rounded upward to the nearest ten cent (104) increment.

or

2. Applicant's currently filed flag drop, per mile, and waiting time rates do not exceed the King County median average for the current filing period by more than ten percent (10%) rounded upward to the nearest ten cent (10ϕ) increment.
