

RESOLUTION NO. 2550

A RESOLUTION of the Port Commission of the Port of Seattle declaring property surplus for Port District purposes and further declaring that said property should be sold or disposed of in a reasonable manner.

WHEREAS, the Port of Seattle has owned the property described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and by this reference incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, due to modifications in the operation of the Port and changes in the needs and requirements of the Port, said property is neither used nor needed for its intended purpose or other purposes of the Port; and

WHEREAS, such property is not part of any comprehensive plan of improvement or modification thereof, adopted by the vote of the people of said district:

NOW, THEREFORE, be it hereby resolved by the Board of Commissioners of the Port of Seattle that the property described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and by this reference incorporated herein is no longer needed for district purposes, and that it is in the best interests of said district that said property be declared surplus and sold or disposed of as provided by statute.

EXHIBIT "A"

The following described property currently owned by the Port is no longer used or needed for its (their) intended purposes and therefore should be declared surplus and disposed of in a manner consistent with state law:

4 Spools of Wire Rope, approximately 575 to 600 ft. each, 1 3/8", 6 x 37, fibre core, Yellow Strand, 2 spools Right Regular Lay and 2 spools Left Regular Lay.

(This rope was manufactured by Broderick & Bascom Rope Co., for specific use on Hitachi Container Cranes with a clam bucket operation. The Port does not have a clam bucket, nor the apparent prospect of such an operation.)
