RESOLUTION NO. 29.

A RESOLUTION Accepting the resignation of C. C. Closson as Assistant Secretary to the Port of Seattle Commission, and appointing W. S. Lincoln to the same position, and fixing compensation.


Be it resolved by the Port Commission of the Port of Seattle as follows:

Section 1. That the resignation of C. C. Closson as Assistant Secretary to the Port Commission be accepted to take effect April 30, 1912.

Section 2. That W. S. Lincoln be appointed to the position of Assistant Secretary <sup>to take effect May 1, 1912,</sup>, and that his compensation be fixed at \$200 per month.
