

RESOLUTION NO.122

A RESOLUTION of the Port Commission of the Port of Seattle declaring the result of the special election held June 17, 1913.

WHEREAS, a special election was held in the Port District of the Port of Seattle on the 17th day of June, 1913, and the ballot boxes from all voting places have been since delivered to the Port Commission, together with the returns of the election officers thereof, and on this day the Port Commission has met and canvassed the returns of such election, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PORT COMMISSION OF THE PORT OF SEATTLE:

Section 1. That the result of said election was and is hereby declared to be as follows:

On Proposition One, viz, the question of ratifying the changes in the comprehensive scheme as provided by Resolution No.116 amending Resolution No.113, in favor thereof 15,082, opposed thereto 2,413 votes, and same carried.

On Proposition Two, viz the question of cancelling the authorization heretofore made by the people for the issue of \$5,000,000.00 in bonds to provide for what is known as the Harbor Island and Harbor Island Supplemental Improvements embraced in propositions 7 and 8, adopted at a special election held on March 5, 1912, and in place thereof authorizing the Port Commission to borrow the sum of \$3,000,000.00 and issue bonds therefor to acquire and construct East Waterway Improvement No.2.

In favor thereof 14,938 votes, opposed thereto 2,692 votes, and the affirmative vote being more than 3/5 of the total vote, the same is carried.

On Proposition Three, viz, the question of borrowing \$200,000.00 and the issuance of bonds therefor to acquire ferry landings and acquire or construct a ferry boat for a ferry service to and from West Seattle.


In favor thereof 13,516 votes, opposed thereto 3,322 votes, and the affirmative vote being more than 3/5 of the total vote, the same is carried.


On Proposition Four, viz, of increasing the number of Commissioners in this Port District from 3 to 5, in favor thereof 5,170 votes, opposed thereto 12,654 votes. and the same is defeated.

On Proposition Five, viz, the question of the general policy of the Port as to direct operation by the Port Commission of the various harbor improvements, in favor thereof 15,478 votes, opposed thereto 1,906, and the same is carried.

ADOPTED by the Port Commission of the Port of Seattle on this 20th day of June, 1913, and signed in open session by its proper officers in authentication of its passage on the same day.
