

RESOLUTION NO. 2337

A RESOLUTION of the Port Commission of the Port of Seattle
urging the United States Government to continue
cargo handling operations at Piers 90-91.


WHEREAS, the Defense Department has announced that Piers 90-91
are surplus to its needs, and

WHEREAS, such termination will disrupt long established, necessary,
and continuing government cargo handling operations, and

WHEREAS, in the case of certain of these cargo functions there is no
reasonable alternative facility for their continued operation,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Port of Seattle urges
the United States Government to make every effort to continue marine cargo
handling operations at the Piers 90-91 complex in Seattle, under whatever
arrangements the Federal Government deems best, so as to maintain the
payrolls connected therewith as an aid to the economy of the Seattle area.

ADOPTED by the Port Commission of the Port of Seattle this 14th day
of July, 1970, and duly authenticated in open session by the signatures of the
Commissioners voting in favor thereof and the Seal of the Commission duly
affixed.
