Airport News (July 31 - August 7)

- Airport Office Building Stairwell Access Door entry to the stairwell from ticketing level to the AOB mezzanine level, will require badging in to access starting August 1. This door is located on ticketing level between the bank of three elevators and the restroom facilities.
- SEA Gateway Project Impacts Starting at 11:45 p.m. on July 31, one elevator at Skybridge 5 will be closed for 24 hours to accommodate project utility work. With no redundant elevator on Skybridge 5, elevator users can be directed to adjacent Skybridges 3 or 6.
- Updated Requirements for Dogs Entering the US Starting on August 1,
 the only required documentation for dogs entering or returning to the United
 States that have been only in dog rabies-free or low-risk countries in the past 6
 months is the CDC Dog Import Form. Additionally, dogs must appear healthy
 upon arrival, be at least 6 months old, and have a microchip that can be
 detected with a universal scanner to identify them.

- Temporary Gates Foundation Installation The promotional exhibit will run

- for six weeks and can be found in the S Concourse on the perimeter of the escalators at the concourse level opposite the Hudson News.
- August International Airline Schedule Changes Turkish Airlines is adding a 2nd flight 3x/week. STARLUX starts service to Taipei on August 16 with service 3x/week.
